Our midyear day on the MAP assessment is complete now. Please look at the table below to see how our students performed from the Fall to the Winter. You will see there were some increases and some decreases in our overall scores. I hope you have been able to review your own child's individual performance on this assessment at this point. This is a great opportunity to speak with your child, and your child's teacher, about any trends you observed in the data. Is your child making adequate progress? Are there more supports you need? What kinds of goals or expectations should I set with my child? What is my next step at home regarding this data? These are the questions we ask ourselves. We use this data to drive our instruction and to make future decisions to help our student increase their academic achievement, and to demonstrate proficiency or growth on the high stakes SBAC assessment.

Assessment data should be important to all of us.

When we make a united effort to talk about the data to support our students, we can make a positive impact on their academic outcomes.

Fantastic 1st grade


