The students in Ms. Mack's, Miss Taylor's, and Mrs. Wilson's rooms have been very busy reading and testing on Accelerated Reader (AR) books. Using the computerized program really helps students with comprehension. We are also



focusing on comprehension and attention to detail during our whole group reading time. We've read some wonderful stories: The Empty Pot, My Rotten Red-Headed Older Brother, Polar Bear Son, and Mice and Beans.

Ask your student to tell you all about them! All students should be memorizing their sight words and practicing math facts. The number bond has helped them learn the relationship between addition and subtraction. In science. we've had fun making lots of noise and learning that vibration causes sound. Ask your child to identify their sound receiver. We are anxiously waiting and watching our garden grow! First graders planted several kinds of seeds, including carrots, radishes, and lettuce. Have you been looking for some online mathematics resources for extra math en-


